

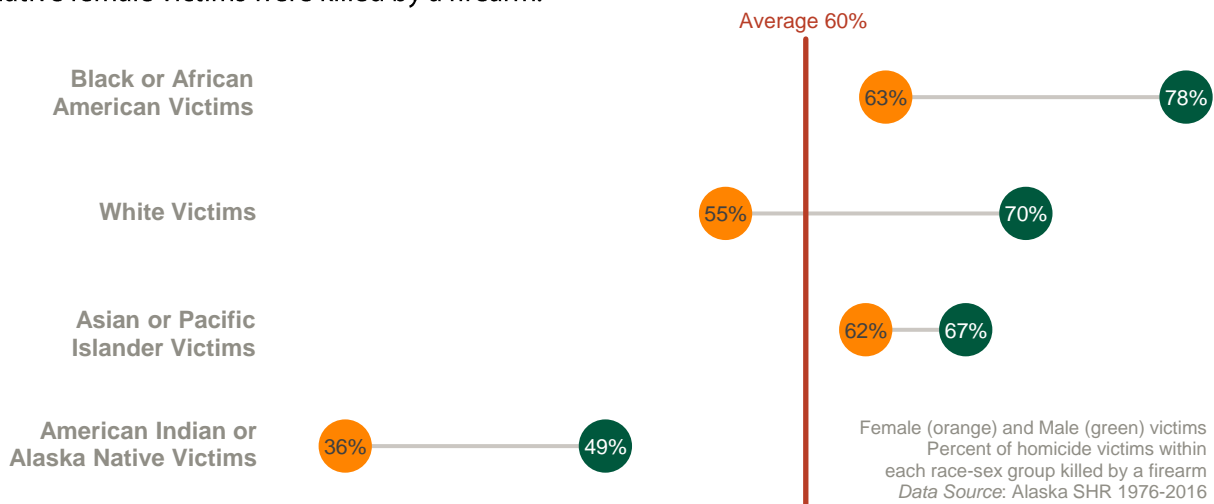
MOST ALASKA HOMICIDES ARE COMMITTED WITH A FIREARM

A FACT SHEET FROM THE ALASKA JUSTICE INFORMATION CENTER REPORT: HOMICIDE IN ALASKA 1976-2016

60% of homicide victims were killed by a firearm

Male victims were killed by a firearm more often than **female victims**. Three-quarters of Black or African American male victims were killed by a firearm, while one-third of American Indian or Alaska Native female victims were killed by a firearm.
