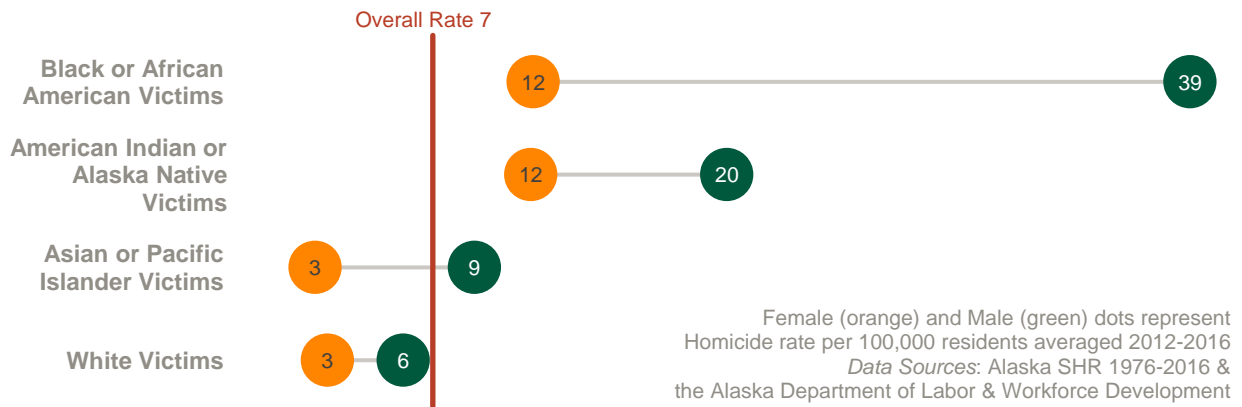


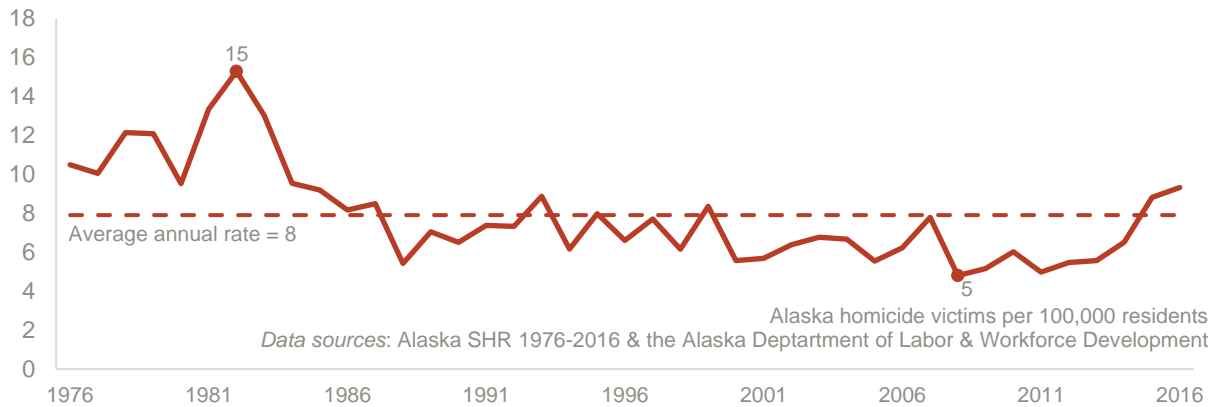
# HOMICIDE VICTIMIZATION IS DISPROPORTIONATE AND DECLINING

A FACT SHEET FROM THE ALASKA JUSTICE INFORMATION CENTER REPORT: HOMICIDE IN ALASKA 1976-2016

**Male victims** were reported at higher homicide rates than **female victims** within each race. Black or African American victims and American Indian or Alaska Native victims of both sexes were killed well above the overall homicide rate.



THE **OVERALL** ALASKA HOMICIDE VICTIM RATE HAS DECLINED FROM ITS PEAK IN 1982, RECORDING ITS LOWEST RATE IN 2008.
