# TECH TIP OF THE MONTH: SUMMER TECH TIPS Summer sun always means lots of fun, but you have to be careful when it comes to your cellular device!

- 1. When your phone overheats: Take your phone out of direct light and extreme temperatures. Overheating can cause serious damage to your phone. Prevent your phone from overheating by turning it off when you aren't using exit out of apps that drain your battery.
- 2. Your phone takes a dip: Put your phone in a water tight bag while going near water or buy a waterproof phone case. If your phone still magically finds its way into a body of water, immediately turn it off and use a cloth or cotton swab to try to dry it out. Get a bowl of uncooked rice and place your phone into it for a night or few days. The rice will absorb the moisture and you might be able to save your phone.
- 3. **Problems with screen visibility**: No one is a fan of that washed out screen when you're outside. Try out an anti-glare screen protector. They are available online, through your wireless carrier or at any tech store.
