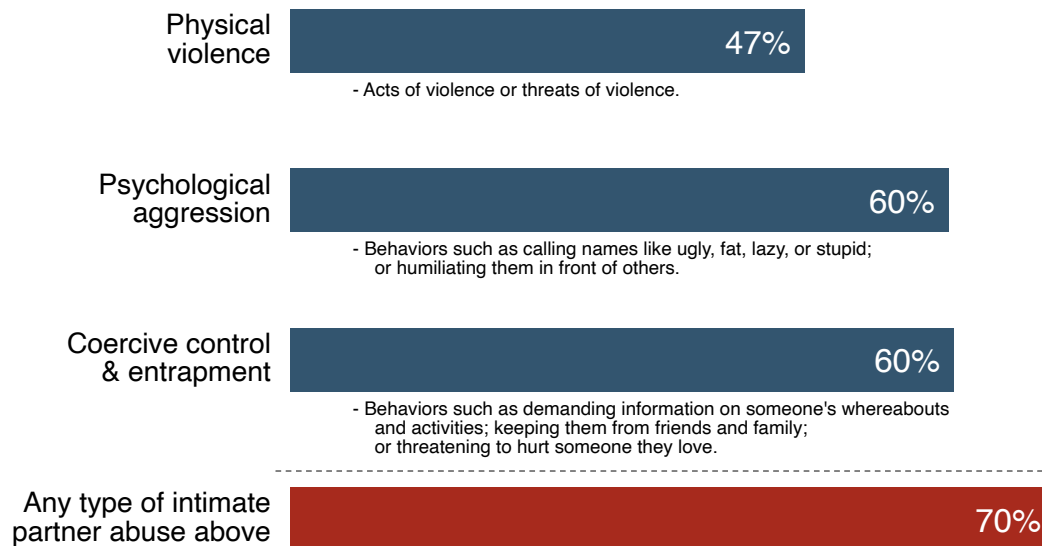
7 out of 10

Intimate partner abuse is more than **physical violence**. It also includes **psychological aggression** (insulting and humiliating behaviors) and **coercive control and entrapment** (behaviors that are intended to monitor, control, or threaten).
