AIME CONFERENCE TO BE HELD ON CAMPUS

Space tracking, new techniques in placer mining, foreign markets for Alaskan products, gas exploration and the oil boom are among subjects to be discussed at the fifth annual Mining, Minerals and Petroleum Conference of the American Institute of Mining, Metallurgical and Petroleum Engineers.

The conference, sponsored by the Alaska Section, AIME, the Southwest Alaska Section, AIME and the U of A was announced by Douglas Huber, Alaska Section president and Glen Chambers, Southwest Alaska Section president.

Outstanding leaders in the field who will speak at the AIME banquets are Dr. Joseph L. Gilson, 1960 president of AIME and chief geologist for DuPont Co. of Wilmington, Del.; and Dr. James Boyd, vice president, exploration, Kennecott Copper Corp., New York.

The conference, which will be held on the U of A campus, April 11, 12 and 13, will be pinpointed towards exploration and will feature leaders in their fields.

Conference sessions with technical talks will be open to the public Dean Beistline stated, and will feature many well-qualified men from Alaska, other states and other nations who are consultants in private industry, in government and in education.

The conference sessions will be held in the Bunnell Lecture Hall on campus.
