GOVERNOR'S DAY SET

Plans for the second annual Governor's Day on Saturday, April 21, are now "firmed up" and all members of the U-A family are invited to share in the festivities. The schedule includes:

- 11:00 a.m. - Ground Breaking Ceremony, Construction site for health, physical education and recreation building, west of residence hall complex.

Among the highlights of the day's programs will be recognition ceremonies for outstanding ROTC cadets, an address by Gov. William Egan, an appearance by the U-A drill teams, recognition ceremonies for many of the contributors toward the first construction to start on campus under the State General Obligation Bonding Program, the actual ground breaking ceremony, and the presence on campus of numerous distinguished leaders (governmental, civic, military) for the ceremonies.

NORWEGIAN GOVERNOR TO VISIT U-A

President William R. Wood will meet Gov. Bue Fjermeros of Norway upon his arrival in Fairbanks, Thursday (April 26).

While on tour of the northern states, Gov. Fjermeros will observe and discuss various state and local government programs and conditions and developments in the political, economic, educational and cultural fields.

Prof. Lee Salisbury is teaching a theatercraft seminar in Juneau, April 16 - 19, through the Division of Statewide Services and with the cooperation of the Juneau-Douglas Community College.

Last year, in cooperation with the Anchorage Community College, a program of adult education was initiated at the Alaska Native Hospital at Anchorage by the Anchorage Tuberculosis Association.

Gov. William Egan, on April 9, signed CSHB311, providing for a supplemental appropriation of \$378,000 for completion of the gymnasium (health, physical education and recreation building).

Dr. Mylo Fritz of Anchorage will speak on his free-lance writing at tonight's meeting of the Farthest North Press Club at 7:30 p.m., Polar Room, Traveler's Inn. Guests are welcome, according to Ray Pierce, secretary.

The Fairbanks Branch, AAUW, is sponsoring a buffet dinner dance at the Fort Wainwright Officers' Club, to begin at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, May 5, with cocktails. The second annual Workmen's Compensation Insurance Workshop of the State Department of Labor was conducted April 16-17 in Anchorage.

Sister M. Ann Elizabeth, C.S.C. of Dunbarton College, Washington, D.C., will be featured on the 16th program in the current series of "Meet the Professor," ABC-TV series prepared in cooperation with the Association for Higher Education.

Tonight at 8 p.m., the theater will open for the first performance of the Arctic Circle Theatre's production of "Picnic" by William Inge, in the Arctic Bowl Theatre, 940 Cowles St. Admission is \$2.25. The production will also be presented tomorrow, Saturday and Sunday.

Armed Forces Day has been designated by the Secretary of Defense as May 19, 1962. The activities will again emphasize the theme "Power for Peace."

William Cheney is expected to arrive on campus early in May to assume his duties as State 4-H Club Leader. He has lived in Alaska for two years, working for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and for Wakefield Fisheries.

Nearly \$24 million worth of Federal Aid construction projects, representing 266 miles of bridges and highways for the state, are now under active contract, Donald A. McKinnon, commissioner of the State Department of Highways, announced April 11.

By-laws were adopted and the officers and directors elected for a newly incorporated Poetry Society of Alaska at a meeting April 9 in Juneau. The society's address is Box 1106, Juneau.

"Chemical and Engineering News," newsmagazine of the chemical world, carries a new "law" in its April 2, 1962, issue. The "law," called Hildebrand's law, is "...the number of courses offered by a college department is inversely proportional to the intellectual distinction of its faculty and the amount of basic knowledge in the field." Dr. Joel Hildebrand, "definer of the law", is the 1962 Priestley medalist.

Recently, the education editor of the New York Times, Fred M. Hechinger, stated that, "While school and undergraduate education is the foundation of learning, graduate study forms the cutting edge of a society's educational strength."

U-A honorary degree recipient Congressman Leo W. O'Brien, Doctor of Laws, 1959, of Albany, N. Y., will address the state dinner of the Western Governors' Conference on Friday, May 4, in Anchorage.

The State Federation of Women's Clubs will meet May 5 - 6 in Nome. Chairman Morva Hoover announced in the Nome Nugget that the meetings will be in the Pioneers Hall and the banquet at the Seaview Room. Representatives of 13 clubs throughout the state are scheduled to attend.

On April 10, Gov. William Egan signed SB267, the Community College Bill, which provides that academic courses offered at community colleges will be under the sole jurisdiction of the U-A.

Capt. J. W. McConville, B.B.A. in Management, 1959, recently received the U.S. Air Force Commendation Medal for meritorious achievement as an academic instructor in the Air Training Command. Ceremonies were at Randolph A.F.B., Tex.

Mrs. Louise Marx, a student at Anchorage Community College, is once more writing a series of columns on gardening in Alaska for the Anchorage Daily Times. This is the fifth year Mrs. Marx has been garden editor of the paper.

Julian E. Rivers presented two tickets to Gov. William Egan for the U-A Drama Workshop presentation of "You Never Can Tell" in the capitol city. The performances were on April 12 and 13 in the Juneau-Douglas high school auditorium.
