## COMMUNITY FUND DRIVE BEGINS

University employees will be contacted by a member of their Department in the near future and asked to contribute to the Fairbanks Coordinated Services Agencies fund drive. The organization was formed by Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, USO, Salvation Army and the Fairbanks Health and Safety Council after the United Fund organization was disbanded following the 1962 campaign.

The new organization operates without paid personnel and provides the contributor with the opportunity to specify how his gift will be distributed among the five participating organizations. Dean Edward Voldseth is directing the fund drive at the University.

## FIRST FACULTY MUSIC RECITAL NOV. 21
