SWIM CLASS OFFERED

The University's first non-credit course in swimming starts next Tuesday evening.

The nine-week course will be offered in two **sections** - one from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. and the other from 8:30 p.m. to 10 p.m. Both sections will be taught by Norman Dupon, the University aquatics instructor.

The course is open to all persons over 16 years of age. Interested persons may pre-register by calling 479-2211, Ext. 205 and reserving a space in either of the two sections. Actual registration will be held in the Patty Building foyer the half hour preceding the first meeting of each of the sections. Each of the classes will be limited to 30 persons. Course fee will be \$15.

Faculty and staff swimming for the next few weeks has been tentatively scheduled for Saturday evening from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Faculty and staff members may also swim during the swim periods on Saturday and Sunday afternoons from 2 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

FLAG CEREMONY TOMORROW

Kieffer Gray, District Director of the United States Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service at Anchorage will be a special guest speaker at the flag presentation ceremony of the International Students' Club tomorrow evening.

The colorful ceremony will be held at 8 p.m. in Constitution Hall. George Wang, president of the Club, will act as master of ceremonies. Student speakers will include Suchai Lhetchamni of Thailand, Caroline Okedara of Nigeria, and Kai Dai of the Republic of China. Music will be provided by Gloria Johansen of Argentina and Shawn Kang of Korea.

Fourteen foreign flags will be presented to the University and their designs will be explained by the students carrying them. Professor Frank Parten will play the national anthems or representative songs for each country represented as its flag is presented. The R.O.T.C. color guard and Drill Team will assist in the ceremony. President Wood will accept the flags for the University.
