



SUNDAY IS 'Scribe-It-To-Em' TIME

All students, faculty, staff, and their families are needed Sunday, Oct. 20, beginning at noon, to help address 50,000 university bond issue fact sheets to the state's voters.

Steve Snyder, student body president and organizer of Sunday's "scribe-it-to-em" party, urges everyone in the campus community to join him in the lounge of the SUB (Constitution Hall) to help with the project.

"We'll begin at noon and scribe away at it until the job is done," Snyder said. "Each person will be asked to give us an hour of his time to address about 100 fact sheets. If 500 persons join in, no one will have to get writer's cramp.

"Everyone involved with this university has a stake in this bond issue. If it succeeds on Nov. 5, we all benefit. But we must work to make it succeed. No taxpayer money is used to promote the bond issue, so we must call on volunteer help.

"We'll have refreshments in the SUB lounge and make a party of it. We have 100 dozen cookies on order. You should come just to see what that many cookies look like in one place.

"One other thing, each person should bring a ballpoint pen to use for addressing."

Ann Tremarello, assistant registrar, recalls a similar "scribe-it-to-em" party several years ago for the Patty Building bond issue. "We addressed the sheets in the SUB, too," she said. "The turn out was tremendous for our size then -- the

SUB was packed. And the nicest thing about it was that everyone came -- faculty, staff, students, and even the alumni were there."

According to Mrs. Tremarello, "The affair was very successful. We got the mailing out to the voters and the bond issue passed."
