COUNSELING INSTITUTE ON CAMPUS

Thirty secondary school counselors from Alaska and other states are registered at the University of Alaska for an eight-week Institute in Counseling and Guidance.

The Institute, financed through a contract with the U. S. Department of Education under the National Defense Education Act (NDEA), is directed by Dr. Kenneth K. Martin, head of Counseling and Testing.

"The function of the school counselor is to assist students in attaining realistic self-understanding, evaluating alternatives, formulating goals and making independent decisions about educational, vocational and personal adjustments," said Dr. Martin. The purpose of the Institute is to increase the understanding and sensitivity of secondary school counselors in working with students, and to help the counselor grow professionally.

In an unusual feature of the Institute the counselors will work under supervision three afternoons a week with local junior and senior high school students and students enrolled in the Upward Bound Program now in progress at the University.

SEEING THE MIDNIGHT SUN

For more than twenty nights from June 20 through June 30 the sun will be seen to circle across the northern sky without setting when viewed from near mile 109 on the Steese Highway. For a few days before and after this period some portion of the sun will always be above the horizon as the sun will not completely set. Because Eagle Summit is east of the center of the time zone the sun will be at its lowest point at 11:45 p.m. Alaska Standard Time and by midnight it will be rising again. Although 75 miles south of the Arctic Circle the combination of the elevation of Eagle Summit, the low northern horizon, and bending of light by refraction within the atmosphere, enables this event to be seen.
