- Bulk e-mail for other than official University business is prohibited. Other bulk e-mailings, including but not limited to partisan political messages, are prohibited.

- State statute provides that the University may not use or permit the use of network resources for partisan political purposes. As a result, no University users may use the network for such purposes.

- Partisan political purpose is defined as anything done with the purpose of differentially benefiting or harming a candidate or potential candidate or political party or group. For more information, see AS 39.52.120(a)(6).

If a significant violation occurs, standard procedures will be used to protect against liability, disruption or damage to the university’s information resources.
