## 10,000 Flowers Campaign needs volunteers and money

Faculty, staff and student volunteers at UAS have launched a campus beautification project, the 10,000 Flowers Campaign, that aims to plant 10,000 bulbs this fall and will result in an explosion of color next spring at the Auke Lake campus.

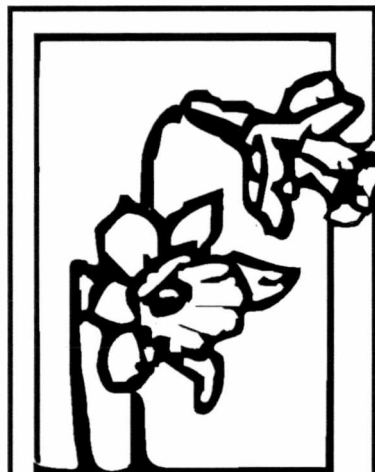
UAS faculty, staff, students and alumni are asked to help in any way they can, which includes financial donations to buy bulbs, volunteering to help plant bulbs in October, and with planning the campaign.

The project was inspired by Tom Gallagher, a faculty member in the School of Business and Public Administration. Gallagher, who is trained as a landscape architect, envisions thousands of blooming daffodils, crocuses and tulips coloring the campus each spring in naturalized drifts.

With the blessing of UAS Chancellor Marshall Lind, Gallagher is heading up an all-volunteer effort. Student Government is contributing funds and volunteers for the project while staff and other faculty members are helping with planning, fundraising and planting of bulbs.

The volunteer committee has set Saturday, October 9 as the date to plant the bulbs. Volunteers will

work in teams to plant the bulbs at sites selected by the planning committee. ## Sitka Campus responds to pulp mill closure

The Sitka campus has responded quickly to help serve Sitka residents as they cope with closure of the local pulp mill, the town's largest employer.

The Learning Resource Center's Debbie Dozier and Lana Elliott have organized community-wide volunteers to answer telephones and help direct mill employees and family members to needed services.

The campus has also launched a series of key information workshops to bring useful information to the community. Continuing Education Coordinator Mary Lauer organized local financial institutions and real estate brokers for the initial program in the series, entitled 'Surviving the Financial Impacts of Mill Closure.' More than 70 people participated.

Faculty member Kathie Etulain is coordinating establishment of the Career Resource Center on campus, a grant-funded, one-stop shop for career counseling, job placement services and access to community resources.
