

## New Vo-Tec Dean appointed

The assistant manager of the Alaska Pulp Corporation's Sitka mill has been appointed as acting dean of vocational-technical education at the University of Alaska Southeast, Chancellor Marshall Lind announced today.



Gary Bowen, 50, will assume his new duties in mid-November. He holds a Ph.D. in fluid mechanics from the University of Minnesota, a master's degree in hydraulic engineering from Stanford University and an undergraduate degree in civil engineering from the University of Alaska Fairbanks. He is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, the American Welding Society and the Technical Association of the Pulp and Paper Industry. He is also a registered, professional, mechanical engineer in Washington and a civil engineer in Alaska.

"We're very pleased that Gary has agreed to help us give our vocational education programs a fresh shot of enthusiasm," Lind said. "He's highly qualified for the position and will be evaluating our programs to determine how they can better serve the public."


Bowen has worked at the Sitka mill for nine years. During that time he was promoted from project engineer to chief engineer and to assistant mill manager. Alaska Pulp Corporation closed the Sitka mill late last month.

His prior work experience includes positions at the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard in Honolulu, Hawaii and at Tonkin & Taylor Consulting Engineers in Auckland, New Zealand.

"Gary will be the first vocational education administrator at UAS to come directly from the private sector. We need that perspective as we review our role in this important part of our overall mission," Lind said.

His academic background also includes eight years as a lecturer and senior lecturer in civil engineering at the University of Auckland in New Zealand.

Bowen's job at UAS will include supervision of such programs as Welding Technology, Diesel Technology, Visitor Industry Program, Health Information Management, Marine Technology and Power Technology.


