Have a blast in the past...

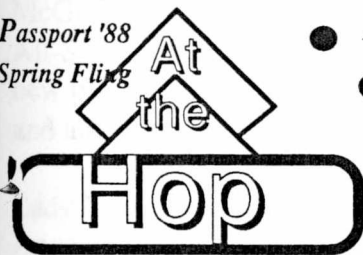

Lady Whales '88/89 roster points to winning season of NAIA play

Coach Sandy Morgan's in-state recruiting for the Lady Whales basketball team has won commitments from two of the state's top women high school players. Karn Mercer of Juneau Douglas High School and Kristin McGilvary from Monroe High School in Fairbanks both plan to play for UAS next year, the team's first season of play in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), District I.

McGilvary's sister, Caroline will transfer from UAF as a junior to play for the Whales, and Ann Bowen joins the team as a junior transfer from Pierce Community College in Tacoma, Washington. Bowen brings to UAS her record as leading scorer in the NWAACC, with 23.2 points per game.

Mercer and Kristin McGilvary both placed on the first All-State Team this year. All four new players carry GPAs of 3.0 and above.

Returning from last year's Lady Whales team are Mercedes Angerman, A.T. McIver, Jodi Johnson, Lori Grant and Barb Seatter.
