## **AJSAC Fact Sheet**

Alaska Department of Corrections: Post-conviction Incarcerated Population, 2005–2014

**ANCHORAGE**, **AK**— The 15-04 issue of the *AJSAC Fact Sheet* presents data on incarcerated population under the supervision of the Alaska Department of Corrections (DOC) from 2005 to 2014. Data was provided by the Alaska Department of Corrections.

- From 2005 to 2014, the **post-conviction incarcerated population** in correctional institutions decreased 2.0%.
- From 2005 to 2014, the incarcerated population convicted of **misdemeanors** decreased 34.1%, while the **felony** incarcerated population increased 5.9%.
- The post-conviction incarcerated population convicted of **felonies** increased for both **male** (+4.0%) and **female** (+29.4%) offenders.
- The post-conviction incarcerated population convicted of **misdemeanors** *decreased* in **male** offenders (-38.8%) and *increased* in **female** offenders (+20.4%).
- Overall, increases were reported in the incarcerated population convicted of crimes against
  persons and property crimes, while decreases were reported for the incarcerated population
  convicted of parole and probation violation crimes and all other crimes. Of special note, the
  number of incarcerated offenders convicted of alcohol and drug crimes declined substantially
  (-22.8%) from 2005 to 2014.
- Overall, the post-conviction incarcerated **female** population increased 27.5%, while the post-convicted incarcerated **male** population decreased 4.4% from 2005–2014.
- From 2005-2014, the **female** incarcerated population saw *increases* in four crime categories, with *decreases* in alcohol and drug crime convictions. The **male** incarcerated population saw *decreases* in four crime categories, with *increases* in crimes against persons.
